The Importance of Data and Politics

It has become abundantly clear in recent months that scientists have been struggling to get their voices heard during the coronavirus pandemic. Health authorities and politicians in turn were not always successful when it came to evidence-based decision-making.

At the same time, the importance of good, up-to-date surveillance of the epidemiological situation has become clear. The same applies to hepatitis B and C: we lack data to measure our progress in the fight against these infectious diseases.
